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Shropshire's best floored by UFO

A 'UFO' landed at the Wrekin Congress and carved a swathe of destruction through the leading ranks of Shropshire's chess players. Bel Ufodike (far right in the picture) beat the likes of Nick Rutter, Nigel Ferrington, and David Everington on his way to victory in the Premier, the top section of the annual tournament, the biggest chess event in Shropshire's calendar. A point clear, Ufodike's win was already in the bag when he took on Simon Fowler, Shropshire's strongest player, in the final round. Had 17-year-old Simon won, he would have had a share of the first prize. But Ufodike, who plays for Whoberley (in Coventry), was anything but wobbly." Away" players also won both the Major and the Minor sections, meaning a complete shutout from the top prizes for Shropshire players. There were 103 competitors in the event held at Madeley Court Centre on Saturday and Sunday.

11th Bury Rapidplay Chess Congress –

11 December 2005

The Eleventh annual Rapidplay Congress organized by Bury Chess Club took place yesterday (Sunday 11 December 2005) at the sumptuous surroundings of the Elizabethan Suite, Bury Town Hall.

This was a full day congress over six rounds, split into three sections – Open, Major and Minor. A hundred players contested total prize money of £820. Players each had 30 minutes to complete each game.

This was a BCF Grand Prix event. The Open counted as triple points, with the Major and Minor counting double.

Sponsors

Michael Wood Homes were again main sponsors of the Bury Rapidplay Chess Congress. Returning sponsors were **Metcalfe & Co Accountants** of Bury and new sponsors were **Winterthur Life**.

The Bury Players

Bury's Brian Forrest won the Ludwig Gruchlik Memorial Trophy, which is awarded annually for the best score from a Bury Chess Club member, with a score of 4.5/6 in the Minor.

Also in the Minor, last year's winner, Paul Mole, lost his second round derby with Brian and went on to finish with 4 points. Lee Baron and Gerry Van Reeve scored 3, Roger Nuttall and Michael Law 2. Jeremy Peach had a win and a loss in the morning before being called away.

In the Open, Paul Macklin suffered terrible time-trouble and finished with 3.

In the Major, Sheraz Khalil and Keith Evans both scored 2, Martin Bryant scored 1.5 and Peter Logan only one draw from his 5 games. Roger Howley and Anthony Lee lost their last round games to joint winners Philip Olbison and Jason Wright to finish just out of the prizes on 4 and 3.5 points respectively.

The M W Homes Open

Featured 4 titled players. International Master Stephen Gordon (3Cs Oldham) won £120 with a score of 5.5/6, drawing only

his final game with Grandmaster and 2003 champion, Nigel Davies (3Cs Oldham). Nigel finished second with 4.5 points after a shock defeat by Ben Hague (Oldham). Ben was unable to stay with the leaders, but joined Adam Ashton, Ali Jaunooby and Dale James, all from 3Cs, on joint third with 4 points, along with Brett Lund (Preston). Ian Campbell won a grading prize.

The Major

This had three joint winners with a score of 5/6 – Philip Olbison (Chorlton), Mkhumba Hope (Salford) and Jason Wright (3Cs Oldham). Chris Vassiliou (Chorlton) won the under 130 grading prize with 4.5. The under 115 grading prize was shared by Vince Logan (Swinton), Derrick Taylor (Rochdale), Chris Jardine (Great Lever) and Eric Gradwell (Wigan)

The Minor

Won jointly by Eric Buck (Wombwell), Ian Malloy (Manchester), David Adam (Harrogate) and Jim Eglington (Urmston) all with a score of 5/6. Sam Towse (3Cs Oldham) won the under 80 grading prize jointly with James Bowler (Churwell School). The under 65 grading prize was won by Jade Stirrup (3Cs Oldham)

Bolton's Rod Middleton and Julian Clissold smoothly controlled the Congress, as always and there were no significant disputes. Many Bury club members helped to organize and run the event. Andrew Butterworth of Chess Direct provided the Bookstall.

Job Description

The County Match Controller is responsible to the ECF Director of Home Chess. The duties of the County Match controller are set out below:

1. Ensure the smooth running of the National Counties Team Championships.
2. This requires the jobholder to
 - Liaise with the Union organizers to establish the number of entrants from each Union.
 - Do the draw for the competition.
 - Inform county captains and Union organizers of the draw for each round.
 - Liaise with county captains and Union organizers to obtain the results of matches.
 - Ensure that the ECF Office, Union websites and the Grading Officer receive copies of the match results including all individual results.
 - Deal with any disputes that may arise (with an appeal to the Home Chess Director if necessary).
 - Organize the finals (note: all counties finals are held at a single central venue).
 - Keep the Director of Home Chess informed of the progress of competitions.
3. The jobholder should preferably be an ECF Arbiter.
