# MIDLAND INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS 1990/1991

## Press Release from Bruce Holland, Director for Public Relations, Midland Counties Chess Union.

This event, held in the Darwin Suite, Derby Assembly Rooms from the 22nd to the 24th March, was concluded with an exciting last round fight between the holder of the title and a younger challenger. The reigning champion, Leicester's Mark Hebden, had just achieved an unbeaten run of eleven games over two championship series, and looked all set to take the title for a second year running with full points out of six games. The challenge mounted by Wolverhampton's Graeme Buckley succeeded, and he won the final game to deny his opponent a clean sweep. This was not enough, however, to wrest the title from the holder, who retained the Forrest Cup on a tie-break. The prize fund of £375 for the top two places was shared by both players.

There were several consolations for Graeme Buckley, who also became the Midlands Under-21 Champion, with a further prize of £25. He also won the right to enter the British Chess Championships. Graeme faces some demanding summer months since he has also been selected to take part in the World Under-21 Chess Championships in Chile during August. The World Championship event follows almost immediately on from the British Championships, which means he will need to be well prepared in order to ride through the acclimatisation.

The other Junior Midland title winners were:

Under-16: Joe Vere (Courtaulds, Derby), on tie-break from Stephen Joseph (Nottingham Gambit), with 2.5/6 in the Championship Section;

Under-14: James Redburn (Radcliffe and Bingham), on tiebreak from Matthew Tailby (Nottingham), with 3.5/6 in the Major Tournament;

Under-12: Emma Nutbrown (Cheddleton), with 1.5/6 in the Minor Tournament.

The Under-18 Championships have been moved to the Birmingham British Championships Qualifying Tournament which is to be held on 14th - 16th June 1991.

#### Grading

The new grading lists, to be published in August, will have the Junior addition incorporated into the grade. This will make life a little easier for congress organisers, who will no longer have to specify grading limits as, e.g., Under-120 or Under 110J. If the addition had not been incorporated into the grade, congress organisers would have been groaning, for the addition is age-related. There are four bands: Under-11s (addition 10 points); 11-14 year olds (addition 8 points); 15-17 year olds (addition 6 points); age less than 18 but no other information (addition 4 points).

## Challenge the Russians

The Beat the Russians campaign, launched by B.C.F. Publicity Director David Norwood, is now more modestly renamed Challenge the Russians. All counties should have received notification of an appeal to raise funds to support the campaign. To further the aim many titled players have offered to play free in fund-raising simuls. How the funds will be used is not explained; if to pay for intensive coaching for promising juniors, well and good; if to engage the services of Ray Keene as a second, ... They wouldn't, would they? And yet David is talking about a rapprochement between Keene and the B.C.F.

#### **B.C.F. Finances**

Neil Graham reports that the BCF levy will rise from £200 for 1990-91 to £220 for 1991-92. The levy is the amount the BCF charges counties for registering fifty players. Neil points out that had counties which did not send a delegate or proxy to the meeting which decided the figure voted for a lower figure, the increase might have been 7.5%, rather than the actual 10%. However, if counties pay the levy by 30th June, they will get a 10% discount.

Meanwhile [adds the editor], after the recent large increase in the levy, and the launch of the direct membership scheme, which we were told, would resolve the BCF's financial problems, the BCF's financial position is not healthy. The target for enrolment of direct members has not been met, some counties are not affiliating, others are saying "Can't pay, won't pay - in full." No sponsor has been found for the British Championship. One of the arguments put forward for seeking a rapprochement with Ray Keene is that he brings in the sponsors; this after the fiasco with Peterborough Software.

The MCCU Annual General Meeting will be held on 9th June. If you care, about these or any other matters, make your views known to your delegates,
