Grading Services

Our own grading supremo, is also the BCF's Director for National Grading. For 2½ years Roger Edwards has been working hard at getting the present national grading arrangements well established. For nine months he collaborated with his predecessor Philip Clemow, in getting the present computer system installed at the BCF HQs in St Leonards, which resulted in the 1988 List being not only being delivered on time, but also the first fully comprehensive list ever seen in this country. The 1989 List continued to be a success story, with errors and problems with the previous year's production being greatly reduced. This year Roger aims to get the 1990 Grading List published a little earlier with a view to making more significant improvements in that respect next year.

The 1990 List will be published on 20th August, and is expected to have a cover price of £7.75 although this may yet be altered.

Other services include an extract of grading results for all players in a club, which can be made available on or around 10th August, with requests from clubs for this service to be received by Roger no later than 6th August. Price is £3.00

Leagues and Counties can also receive an extract from the system for the players recorded as belonging to them, for costs and details contact Roger Edwards.

If anyone, congress, club, or other chess organisation is interested in placing advertising in the grading list, the price will be £25 fora full page or £13 for a half page. The copy has to be submitted by 1st August.

At the end of April "The Times" published on its front page a report that former World Champion, Anatoly Karpov, had been beaten by a computer which had been entered against him as part of a simultaneous display. The BCF Intermediate Club Championships

The 1990 Birmingham Post Cup

The semi-final stages of this competition are approaching, but yet to be determined. Another semi-final place is at stake between Lionel Lewis (Mutual Circle) and KR Milner (Malvern). Players like David Anderton, Graeme Buckley, and six times winner Craig Dawson are still in the fight.

Peter Gibbs reminds us he would like to see an even stronger entry than ever for the 1991 Birmingham Post Cup. The closing date will be November 30th, 1990. All players living in Staffordshire, Worcestershire, and Warwickshire are eligible. The entry fee is £2.00
